Resolution No. 51 of 2023

WHEREAS the Town of Denning wishes to use the New York State Office of State Comptroller ARPA funds. The final balance of ARPA Funds (\$13,598.07) is to be transferred to the Highway Fund for infrastructure expenses which will expend the final balance of ARPA Funds received by the Town of Denning.

WHEREAS the Town of Denning Town Board may authorize the Supervisor to transfer funds from the General Fund to the Highway Fund, and

- Personal service line is increased by 2%.
- ➤ Highway employees increased \$1.00 per hour.
- Discussion regarding dramatic increases in Health Insurance and NYS Retirement.
- Discussion regarding increased heating and electric costs.

- > Review of the revenue section is also completed.
- > 3.9% increase so Budget is over the tax cap. Discussion follows.
- > Supervisor Brooks requests any suggestions to modify the budget. None are made.
- It is noted that the recently increased land taxes for NYS owned properties in Denning will hopefully offset the increase for residents in the 2024 County/Town tax bill.
- ➤ Highway Superintendent Van Saders is hopeful there will be an increase in CHIPS for 2024 and comments that blacktop prices continue to fluctuate.
- > Supervisor Brooks is hopeful that taxes will remain about the same.

Supervisor Brooks calls for any further Councilmen comments or discussion. There is none.

Supervisor Brooks calls for any further Public comments or discussion. There is none.

Motion to adjourn the 2024 Budget Workshop at 7:03 pm by Councilman Mike Dean and seconded by Councilman Paul Schoonmaker. All in favor.
