Public Hearing called to order at 6:02 pm by Supervisor Brooks. Held on Tuesday, September 9th, 2024

The Public Hearing regarding Local Law No. 1 of 2024 Tax Levy Override is opened by Supervisor Brooks. Supervisor Brooks states that this law is a budgetary tool and Denning has used it every year since he has been Supervisor. It is put in place at this time in case it is needed during the Budget adoption process. Supervisor Brooks explains that it may be needed in case costs go above what is expected as the Budget is being created and costs, such as that for Health Insurance, is more expensive than anticipated. It is getting more and more difficult to stay under the tax cap with rising costs. Supervisor Brooks asks if there are any questions or comments regarding Local Law #1 of 2024. There are none.

Motion to adjourn the Public Hearing at 6:06 pm made by Councilman Scott Mickelson and Seconded by Councilman Mike Dean.

Regular Town Board Meeting is called to order at 6:06 pm by Supervisor Brooks.

The Town Clerk provided all Board members with a copy of the Agenda and Resolution Nos. 51, 52 and 53, and the Budget vs. Actual through August 2024.

Correspondence – by Supervisor Brooks:

- Email received from NYMIR regarding 10/3/24 Training Webinar for Workplace Harassment/Discrimination Prevention and Workplace Violence Prevention. Discussion follows.
- ➤ Renewal information email received regarding Delta Dental Insurance. It is noted that there is no increase in rates for 2025.
- > Email from Ulster County regarding the Hazard Mitigation Plan and request for Resolution.
- > Thank You letter received from the Daniel Pierce Library thanking the Denning Town Board for their Pumpkin Party Booklet ad donation.
- ➤ Email update regarding Broadband services for underserved areas in Denning. Margaretville Telephone Company applied for grant with help from Ulster County proposing a point-to-point fiber network.
- > Check received from NYS for Supplemental Aims \$6,426.00.
- ➤ Email from UCCRA with 2025 Proposed Budget Information. Tipping fees will be increased \$20 per ton. Everything else is the same. Supervisor Brooks informs the Board that Town of Wawarsing is fighting the proposed new landfill location. Discussion follows.
- ➤ Highway Superintendent Leonard Johnson forwarded a Shared Services Agreement with the Town of Fallsburg. Board all in Favor. Waiting for shared services agreement with Neversink.
- ➤ Letter from Ulster County Self-Insurance with cost for 2025 Budget information- \$13,474.23. Substantial increase from 2024.
- ➤ Request from Denning Justice Court regarding 2024/2025 JCAP Grant requests. The Board unanimously agrees that funding for a replacement generator servicing the Justice Court and Town Hall should be requested. The Town Clerk is requested to contact Power Generator Services, LLC for price quotes for the grant application.

- ➤ Check from Ulster County for the additional 1% sales tax for 2023 in the amount of \$13,687.75. The County also provided documentation regarding the proposed renegotiation of the sales tax sharing agreement in February of 2026 possibly based on population of Towns. At the 2020 Census Denning's population is 493, the 2nd smallest Ulster County Town. Discussion follows.
- ➤ Check received from the Frost Valley YMCA for the June 2024 donation (which was inadvertently missed previously) The Denning Town Board expresses its ongoing gratitude to CEO Riel Peerbooms, and the Frost Valley Board of Trustees for their continued support.
- ➤ Estimate received from pest control company for racoon/rat and other pest issues at the Town Barn and Town Hall. \$399.00 Initial set up and \$85.00 per month. They offer a warranty. The Board approves a one-year trial period.

Highway Report - Highway Superintendent Leonard Johnson reports:

- > Chip sealed Brooks Hill Road and VanAken Road in Sundown.
- ➤ Cut gras and brush on Brooks Hill, VanAken, Dymond, Whitehouse and Raymond George Roads in Sundown.
- > Started grass and brush cutting on Peekamoose Road.
- Maintenance and cleaning at Town Barn
- > Hauled millings to Dinch Road.
- Researching for truck to replace Ford 550. Ford stated it needs \$21,000 worth of work. Will take it for a second opinion at Strictly Ford in Bullville. Received one estimate. Superintendent Johnson states It is running fine at this time.
- Checked roads after recent storm.
- > Checked on the new truck (International) at Arkel Motors. Discussion follows.
- > New Tractor is working fine and maintenance has been good. No issues
- ➤ Requests Town Board approval to look into getting a Buffalo Turbine. \$6,500.00 estimate.
- ➤ Approximately \$122,000 for chip sealing. May be able to do a bit more paving depending on weather and Lyle at Ulster County and Preston at Neversink being available.

Planning Board Report - by Liaison, Councilman Kevin Smith:

- Councilman Smith reports that although he was unable to attend the August Planning Board meeting, planning board member Katherine Parr took notes for him.
- ➤ Yaquby, Plank and Ellis Short Term Rental (STR) applications received final approval. Nicolleti STR was postponed as the applicant did not attend the August meeting. A new STR application was submitted by resident Shannon McGarity 24 Woodfield Road.
- ➤ The Planning Board is having continued discussions regarding the STR applications and issues with the Ulster County Planning Board.
- ➤ Travis Coddington attends the Town Board Meeting to speak to the Board regarding Planning Board matters. He states that the Planning Board is asking the Town Board to review capping the number of STR's in Denning. He believes the last census stats show 172 dwellings in Denning. Many are second homes. Suggests that the Town Board may want to consider: 1. changing the land status of approved STRs to commercial property. 2. Limiting a resident to one STR in Town as a few residents have multiple properties operating as STRs. 3. More enforcement of the current zoning law. Supervisor Brooks does state that Denning has approximately 30 STRs according to Ulster County report that he received. Discussion follows.

Resolution No. 53 of 2024

Section 1. This plan, approved by the community, may be edited or amended after submission for review, but will not require the community to re-adopt any further iterations. This only applies to this specific plan and does not absolve the community from updating the plan in 5 years.

- > J-Cap grant finalization for signature and submission by the end of September.
- ➤ He has received no information regarding the bank merger issue. School taxes are required to be mailed in or paid in person only at the Wayne Bank in Liberty.
- ➤ Supervisor Brooks requests input from the Board Members present regarding setting the date for the 2025 Budget Workshop. After short discussion it is decided that the 2025 Budget Workshop will be held following the next Town Board Meeting on October 8, 2024.

- ➤ Councilman Scott Mickelson reports that there is currently one matter that was rescheduled for the next Court date of September 18th.
