Correspondence – by Supervisor David Brooks.

- Email received from Shandaken Supervisor Peter DiSclafani confirming he has heard that his Town's application for a speed reduction on the Frost Valley Road is still in process with New York State. Denning's application has not been addressed by NYS at this time. Ulster County DPW has no record of an answer from the State on this matter. Supervisor Brooks will contact the Ulster County Sheriff Juan Figueroa about the possibility of getting a speed sled posted.
- Received May donation check to the Town from the Frost Valley YMCA in the amount of \$8,300.00. Supervisor Brooks and the Denning Town Board express their gratitude to CEO Riel Pierbooms and the Frost Valley Board of Trustees for their ongoing support.
- Received check from Ulster County in the amount of \$12,008.68 for Sales tax collected January to March 2025.

Denning is rated 11th out of 22 towns regarding overall taxes being paid, a good place to be right in the middle. Discussion follows.
- Reports that he has FOILED Ulster County to get the official report on the Sundown-Whitehouse Fire. Nothing has been received to date.
- > Reports that the Town Hall generator is having electrical issues.
- Reports that the Sundown Stream Project contract has been signed and sent back. Waiting for fully signed documents.

Councilmen Comments:

- > Councilman Gregory Vurckio reports that there was no CWT meeting last week.
- Councilman Scott Mickelson reports that the speeding ticket matter before the Court was postponed until July. Councilman Mickelson hasn't heard of any problems or tickets regarding the Blue Hole / Peekamoose area. The NYS DEC parking area and walkway to Blue Hole are not completed at this time.
- Councilman Mike Dean asks Supervisor Brooks how his meeting with the Frost Valley YMCA went. Supervisor Brooks reports that the meeting has been postponed to June 18th at 11 am. Councilman Dean requests that Highway Superintendent Johnson meet with him to show him where the pipe on Denning Road will be going.
- > Councilman Kevin Smith has no further comments.

Public Comments:

- Paul Hnatiw reports that an additional pick-up truck has been brought up to the Van Wagner property and feels that it is too close to the road. It arrived last month. Mr. Hnatiw points out that it has now been seven years since he has been commenting on the issues regarding the Van Wagner property.
- Paul Hnatiw also notes that there are issues at the Harrison house as well with farm animals (chickens, pigs and dogs) in the road. Also, that there are children playing in the road at that address as well. He reports that he believes that the pigs got loose and wrecked the neighbor's lawn as well. Discussion continues regarding if any additional structures have been erected on the property and if there is a water course there. Mr. Hnatiw reports there is. Supervisor Brooks reports that the he will do a site visit.
- > William Leudemann is present to observe and has no further comments.

Supervisor Brooks asks if there are any further Councilmen comments. There are none. Any further Public comments. There are none.
